Registering the death

During the pandemic the doctor will be able to scan and email the Medical Certificate Cause of Death to your registrar so you don't have to take it there in person. You should then make a telephone appointment with the registry office to register the death.

Ask the registry office if the <u>Tell Us Once</u> scheme is available. This scheme lets you report a death to most government organisations in one go.

Benefits

If you receive Carers Allowance this will continue for 8 weeks after the death of your loved one. The death of the person you looked after may have an effect on your own financial situation and you may need to find out which benefits you can claim now your circumstances have changed. Housing

Your housing situation may change when your caring role changes or comes to an end. If renting you may have Succession rights over the tenancy. If you have a mortgage the details of your mortgage will determine what happens.
